Andrew Burton McCallum (1916 - 1983)

Founder of the Clan MacCallum - Malcolm Society, Order of Merit Recipient

Andrew Burton McCallum founded the Clan MacCallum/Malcolm Society in 1971 with the guidance and approval of Lt. Colonel George Malcolm of Poltalloch, the 18th Chief of the name MacCallum and Malcolm.

The Society was the result of several years of organization at the Grandfather Mountain Highland Games in North Carolina. An original society existed in Scotland prior to 1914, but disbanded after key officers were lost in World War I.

Andrew McCallum was a founder of the Scottish American Society of Central Florida and a founder of the Orlando Scottish Highland Games in 1978. He was a member of the St. Andrew's Society of the Middle South, the St. Andrew's Society of Winter Park, the Scottish American Military Society and others.



In 1981 Andrew was named Lifetime Convener of the Clan MacCallum/Malcolm Society by the 19th Laird of Poltalloch, Robin Malcolm.

He was born in Birmingham, Alabama in 1916, was a World War II veteran of the South Pacific, and retired from the United States Air Force.

Duncan McCallum, born in 1819 in Campbeltown, Scotland, settled in Woodbridge, Ontario. 150 years later, a great-grandson he would never know founded a society worldwide to honor the name MacCallum and Malcolm.

In 2008, the Award of Merit was presented to Andrew (posthumously) at the Orlando Scottish Highland Games. Accepting the Award for his father was Donald McCallum.
