Robin Neill Lochnell Malcolm, 19th Laird of Poltalloch and Hereditary Chief of Clan MacCallum/Malcolm was born in Edinburgh on February 11, 1934. In 1962 he married the late Susan Freeman (1939-2004). They have two sons and two daughters.

From 1940 to 1944 Robin and his sister Bridget lived in America. Firstly in California with distant relatives (see "Notable" Robert Malcolm) then in Washington DC. He attended 6 different schools in 7 years! He was educated at Eton and the North of Scotland College of Agriculture.

As for farming, on the 5,000 acre Poltalloch estate, he raises cattle and sheep. In agri-politics, Robin has been active both locally and nationally. In local government, for 15 years he was a member of Argyle and Bute Council where he has served as a Justice of the Peace and Vice Lord Lieutenant.
